Success Coach

Develop services based on assessed needs of reunified, adoptive and guardianship families:

- Child behavior/mental health concerns
- School issues
- Ongoing emotional support for families
- Assistance with financial needs/child care
- Parenting skills/discipline
- Social/emotional support for children



What is Success Coach?

Voluntary Service Offered at point of reunification, adoption, or guardianship

Success Plan 2 Year Duration

Measurable Child Well-Being Indicators:

Mental/Emotional Health
Family Functioning
Caregiver Self-Sufficiency
Child's Education
Environment
Social/Community Capital or Support
Reduce risk of repeat maltreatment
Reduce the risk of reentry to foster care
Increase social support for the family
Increase family self-sufficiency
Increase family's ability to manage crises
Increase parent's ability to access medical & mental health services for the child
Increase parenting skills
Increase child's ability to perform on or above grade level in school
Increase parent's ability to advocate for and access educational services


